3. HAZARDS IDENTIFICATION

A. EMERGENCY OVERVIEW:

4. FIRST AID MEASURES

FIRST AID MEASURES FOR ACCIDENTAL:

Eye Exposure:

7. HANDLING AND STORAGE

Avoid breathing vapors and mists. Avoid direct or prolonged contact with skin and eyes. Use nonsparking tools and grounded/bonded equipment and containers when transferring.

Store in tightly closed containers. Store in an area that is dry, well-ventilated, away from ignition sources, away from incompatible materials (see Section 10. Stability and Reactivity), Expected shelf life if stored at recommended temperatures: 12 months.
